R&R = Reflect & Revise We want to give you feedback on:


- > what you did during the last cycle;

- Had great conversations about your students and about mathematics.


All taught the lesson.


The goal is part of the essence of lesson study.



The written report should deepen the work, not make it more tedious.

It is important to prepare for the observation and have a structured debrief.

What we're going to change for the next cycle.



Ask for a team product with clearer guidelines.

Provide lesson plan format that emphasizes anticipating student responses and preparing teacher responses to students.

Revised End of Cycle Written Reports

Similarities:

- At the end of the cycle, you reflect and summarize your ideas.
- Report will be collected at end of cycle workshop (May 21, 2003).

Changes:

- Each team will submit 1 report.
- No individual work will be collected.

Contents of Written Report

- Background Information on lesson. (created for outside observers)
- Instructional Plan of Lesson.
- o Reflections on the Research Lesson.

You will also hand in attendance records and meeting logs for project funding purposes.


